# **COVID-19 Contact tracing during the Easter holiday**

Schools have been asked to remain contactable for a six-day window after the end of term so that we can assist with contact tracing where necessary. This will allow enough time for positive coronavirus (COVID-19) cases to be identified and confirmed by a test and for relevant contacts in the education setting to be traced.

Parents and carers only need to inform the school of a positive case where your child developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in school as the individual may have been infectious whilst in their education setting. As there will not be any staff in school, please notify us by sending an email to <a href="mailto:enquiries@curbar.derbyshire.sch.uk">enquiries@curbar.derbyshire.sch.uk</a> School will check the email account at least once a day.

If notified of a positive case, we would then send a notification letter via email to the family of any children who had been in close contact. The letter would contain guidance about what you and your household should do in these circumstances.

If your child develops symptoms **more than 48 hours since** being in school, you should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.



#### Attendance

Despite a global pandemic, our attendance for the year so far has been great and currently stands at 98.52%. This is above our whole school target of 97% which is amazing. Even with the challenges, thanks to everyone who has ensured that their children are in school as often as possible. Thanks also for supporting us with the slightly staggered start and end times to the day. It allows us to ensure the children can arrive and leave in smaller numbers.

### **PTFA Chocolate Bunnies**


