Dear Parents and Carers

Staffing Update



Shine Assembly

Shine Assembly was always a favourite part of the week and we are pleased to announce its proper return on **Friday 17th September at 9:10am**. In more good news, we will be inviting **one adult** of each winner to attend the Shine Assembly in person. **We are still mindful of Covid in school and we kindly ask that you choose to wear a mask whilst in the school building and sanitise on arrival.** We ask that you wait on the playground until you are invited into school. This will allow us to get the children into the room first. If your child is in receipt of either of these awards, we will notify you by text the Friday before the assembly (a week's notice).

A quick reminder of how our Friday 'Shine Assembly' works - one child from each year group will receive a 'Shine Award' from their teacher for demonstrating spectacular learning throughout the week. Secondly, nominated children from each class will receive a 'Citizenship Award' for being a wonderful member of the school community based on the school citizenship theme that week. The teachers will not tell the class who has won each week so it is a surprise during assembly. You may choose to do the same when you receive that text.

We have splashed out on some new trophies this year for our Shine and Citizenship winners – the children are very excited! These trophies are for our winners to **take home for the week** – sorry, you can't keep them! We ask that they are returned the Thursday of the following week ready to give to new winners at the next Shine Assembly.



Assembly themes

To support the spiritual, moral, social and cultural awareness of children, we follow assembly themes. Each theme lasts two weeks and is the basis of behaviour for learning across school for that time. The weekly citizenship awards are also based on the assembly themes. For your information, the themes this half term are: caring, helpfulness and courage.

Attendance


Our attendance for last year was an incredible 98.52%. This was above our whole school target of 97% which is amazing. Even with the challenges, thanks to everyone who has ensured that their children are in school as often as possible. Thank you for also ensuring that the children are on time so that they can begin their learning promptly. To remind you, children can come into school from 8.50am to be ready for learning in the classroom by 9am.

The school library

The PTFA generously funded the creation of our amazing library and some of the wonderful books in it. We have added to the great range of books on offer - both fiction and non-fiction.

One of the reasons for a library is to engender a love of reading and for the children to pick a book that is exciting and wondrous. It might not be a book they can read but they chose it because they love the cover or the pictures or the title. They have chosen it because it is magical.

Unfortunately, Covid-19 circumstances have meant that the children have not been able to use the library as we originally intended. However, we now want the children to be able to continue their love of reading and take home some of our library books. These will be in addition to their normal home reading books.



We plan that they will be doing this over the coming week or so.

Each class will be allocated a library day when they can choose a book to take home. We ask that the children return the library book on the class library day the following week. Once returned, they can choose a new book. We will not be able to provide your child with a new book until they have returned their used library book. Please ensure the books are looked after and returned so other children can enjoy them. We hope that your child and family enjoy the amazing experiences that books and reading can bring.



Website Update


We have updated some key pages on our school website. Please have a look at your child's class pages and the curriculum section of the website which have a wealth of useful information about what we teach the children and much more.

Class newsletters

School Dinners

Our wonderful school dinners cost £2:20 for this year. School dinners are free to those children who are in KS1 and those in receipt of Free School meals. Please note that these can be paid for on Parent Pay. Please pay in advance either on a weekly or half termly basis.

Income Based Free School Meals

For every child who qualifies for free meals due to family income or benefit levels, our school receives the maximum funding (£1320) to support your child through something called the Pupil Premium. It is only available to schools **if you apply and are eligible** for income based free school meals. With Pupil Premium funding, schools can organise extra help and support for children.

Applying for free meals is very quick and easy so if you think you may qualify for free school meals, please still take the time to apply. Even though your child might be able to have a free meal anyway, **our school needs the funding that comes from Income Based Free School Meals**. 


